Registration for summer lessons is now available! Our summer lessons schedule will begin June 1st and run through August 31st. You may sign up for summer lessons with our Cedarhill Staff. Lessons will take place on Monday through Friday at 5:00, 6:00 and 7:00 p.m. Students who sign up for at least four lessons for the month will receive the discounted session rate of \$50 per lesson. Payment is due at the time of registration. Any additional lessons for our session riders are always billed at the discounted rate of \$50. All other students will be billed at the regular \$65 per lesson.

For our students who own their horses, Brenley will be teaching on Wednesday mornings at 8:00, 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. Our students who half-lease horses will have Saturday and Sunday as their designated "hack" days.

Understand that once you sign up for a lesson you are committing to that time slot. We regret that there are no make-up lessons and no refunds. This is simply not possible due to our large number of students. If you have any questions or

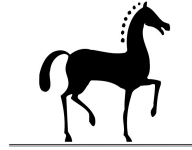
